<u>In 1990</u> bus chiefs axed route 55 from Lea Bridge Road. That left just the 48 & 56. There were 12 buses an hour at the busiest times.

In 1997, following a successful campaign by Save Our Buses, Route 55 returned . That meant 18 buses an hour in the peaks – a 50% increase!



<u>In 2016</u> there are close to 30 buses an hour during rush hours along Lea Bridge Road. The 55 alone runs every 5 minutes into Central London.

These services provide quality, high frequency public transport to densely populated areas of Leyton & Walthamstow where car ownership is low.

Wards closest to Lea Bridge Road are among the most deprived in the Borough. Large numbers of residents depend on the buses.

Waltham Forest Council intends to axe large sections of the Lea Bridge Road bus lanes. Their introduction led to Route 55 being restored to Leyton.

Question for the London Borough Of Waltham Forest:

Why risk the future of our routes again?
