W15 Passengers Quit Unreliable Service

Tfl's most recent reliability figures for the W15 bus show a service failing to make the grade. The Higham Hill to Hackney route struggles to keep on time, despite being given extra resources.

Meanwhile more than 765 000 passengers ditched the service in the year to April 2016, a drop of almost 14%.

Over the last year, the W15 has been hit by increased congestion in Walthamstow Town Centre. This has resulted in:

- Longer journey times
- Uneven spacing of buses
- Shortened journeys (See picture)
- Fewer buses reaching each end of the route
- Passengers waiting longer at stops



In 2014, with over 6m passengers, the W15 was the Capital's busiest single-deck bus service.

The strategic role of the W15 in Waltham Forest's public transport network is evident. It integrates with other bus services, provides interchange with rail services at Leytonstone & Walthamstow Central stations and directly links Whipps Cross & Homerton Hospitals.

Route W15 passenger numbers have declined over two successive years, to stand at 4.81m. Urgent action is needed to get the buses moving & encourage people back on board the W15.
