

Plan To Axe City Route Confirmed

48

Disappearing

The 48 bus linking Waltham Forest, Hackney, The City and London Bridge is set to be axed within months if bus chiefs get their way. It forms part of a raft of cuts to routes across the Capital.

Save Our Buses (SOB) raised awareness of the risk to the 48 back in June 2018.

A direct question to London Mayor, Sadiq Khan met with silence.

Hackney Leads The Way

Reports in the Hackney Gazette show the Borough's political leadership being swift to react.

Mayor, Philip Glanville described the 48 cut as "unacceptable".

This was echoed by Deputy Mayor, with responsibility for transport, Cllr Feryal Demirci. She also raised concerns about some of Hackney's most deprived and least connected neighbourhoods around Clapton Park and Lea Bridge.
